During the 2020-2021 school year MCA was able to complete the standard driven, biblically integrated curriculum program via 5-day seated instruction while simultaneously serving virtual learners with excellence. The MCA instructional staff continues to develop and implement innovative instructional methods which have produced indicators of high levels of student achievement.

After reviewing the standardized IOWA data representing the 3rd - 7th grades, our MCA students performed well above the national average with as much as an 11% increase in some areas. MCA 3rd graders as a whole reached the 77% national average in complete composite scores, a profound achievement. This data, coupled with the Upper School standardized testing data, (where our students once again scored well above the national average), is a critical and strong indicator that our MCA curriculum and instruction program is aligned with the mission to pursue excellence in education. 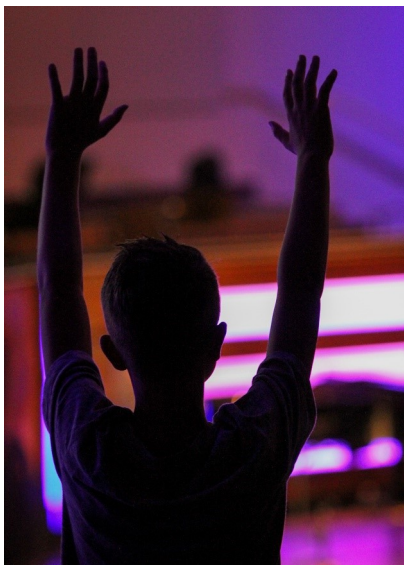
